1. **Accreditation/Assessment** (Sheryl Wynn, Ashley Steveley)
 - a. Eighty-five percent (85%) of accreditation required documents have been approved internally.
 - b. The Steering Committee for the Community Health Assessment met, selected and ranked health priorities for Greene County. The four priority areas are Chronic Disease, Mental Health and Substance Use, Maternal Child Health and Unintentional Injury. Each area will explore access, cost and ease of navigating the healthcare system.

- b. *Early Intervention/Help Me Grow*
 - i. All referrals for both programs began processing through the Cleveland Site Center effective 08/0/17.
 - ii. The Early Intervention team received 100% compliance for the 45-day compliance cycle.

4. **Environmental Health** (Jeff Webb)

- a. *Food*
 - i. The health district successfully passed the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) Food Program survey which included administrative and field reviews of the sanitarians. The favorable and final written report should be received in August or September.
 - ii. The health district cancelled the July 24 Level 1 food certification class due to limited registration.
 - iii. R. Schairbaum presented information about grilling and food safety during the monthly WBZI Health Information Show in collaboration with Greene and Soin hospitals.
- b. *Housing*
 - i. J. Gruza continues working with Adult Protective Services to help clean out a housing nuisance situation at a residence in Yellow Springs. Bids are currently being accepted by the resident for clean-up services.
 - ii. J. Gruza is working with a resident on Foust Road to clean out a housing nuisance situation there as well.
 - iii. J. Gruza and J. Webb responded to a housing complaint received from the Greene County Sheriff during a welfare check. The 90-year-old Bath Township resident was removed from the home during the clean-up and repair.
- c. *Mosquito Control*
 - i. Four ticks were submitted for identification; two Dog Ticks, one Deer Tick and one Lonestar Tick. Deer ticks can transmit Lyme disease. In Ohio in 2017, 30 human cases of Lyme disease have been identified. The Dog Tick can transmit Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever. Five human cases



of Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever have been identified in Ohio so far this year.

- ii. The health district continues to apply larvicide and inspect breeding sites in areas of known mosquito activity and in areas of new complaints when mosquito breeding activity is present. Trapping of mosquitoes has begun and two shipments of mosquitoes have been sent to the ODH laboratory for testing for West Nile Virus. Test results are pending.

- i. D. Shontz is investigating an animal bite from a pet raccoon in Caesarscreek Township. Raccoons are considered wild animals, known to carry rabies and cannot be given a valid rabies vaccination. The ODH veterinarian has recommended that the animal be euthanized and tested for rabies, but the owners are unwilling to comply as of this date. A Troy veterinarian has been caring for the raccoon and vaccinating the raccoon for rabies against the advice of ODH.
