4. **Emergency Preparedness** (Kim Caudill)

- a. The agency participated in *Chaos and Confusion*, a regional exercise on 11/09/17 and 11/13/17. All available staff participated in the exercise.

5. **Environmental Health** (Jeff Webb)

a. *Food Establishments/Services*

- i. Environmental Health leadership with the assistance of D. Brannen are reviewing the results of the completed quality of services survey. The goal is to implement a quality improvement plan prior to the start Of the new food licensure year on 03/01/2018.

b. *Mosquito Control*

- i. The Mosquito Control program has concluded for the year. The final Department of Health (ODH) report for the ear was released 10/27/17 and reflected the following:
 1. Mosquito pools in 47 counties tested positive for West Nile Virus (WNV).
 2. Greene County had 20 mosquito pools test positive for WNV in Beavercreek, Bellbrook, Fairborn and Sugarcreek Townships.
 3. One confirmed human case of WNV in Greene County and 27 confirmed cases throughout Ohio.
 4. One WNV related death in Ohio.
- ii. There were four confirmed human cases of Zika in Ohio related to overseas travel.

c. *Nuisance*

- i. The housing nuisance on Yellow Springs-Fairfield Road is cleaned up but still has needed repairs to be completed.
- ii. J. Gruza continues to work with the Village of Yellow Springs and Adult Protective Services regarding a nuisance. The village is discussing the merits of assisting with funding for the cleanup.
- iii. D. Shontz continues to work with the Shawnee Hills Property Owner’s Association regarding rodents. The main problem property has cleaned



up and removed some harboring items.

d. *Plumbing*

i. Greene County Public Health entered into an agreement with Clark County to provide plumbing inspection services as need. K. Ploutz provided half-day inspection services on 11/01, 11/20, 11/21 and 11/22/17.

e. *Special Services*

i. Two employees of the Fetch Pet Store, The Mall at Fairfield Commons, have been confirmed with campylobacter infection. Test results from the puppies at the local pet store were insufficient to connect the puppies to the exact strain of campylobacter that is related to the national outbreak. ODH and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) continue to recommend sanitation improvements at the store.

ii. M. Isaacson and S. Adams are collaborating with Sugarcreek Township officials regarding a proposed agritourism facility, wedding/barn venue. The facility would have an on-site sewage system and need to meet all building and fire regulations.

a. A Shigella investigation initiated on 10/29/17 in Fairborn has been completed. Eight possible cases were identified and the incubation cycle has now passed.
