



GREENE COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH HEALTH COMMISSIONER'S REPORT February 23, 2018

1. **Administration** (Melissa Howell)
 - a. *Accreditation* (A. Steveley and S. Wynn)
 - i. We responded to the Completeness review for Accreditation and are now awaiting a date for our site visit.
 - ii. We completed the Ohio Performance Profile Database required by the State of Ohio on 01/17/18.
 - iii. We participated in a conference call with Ohio State University's Center for Public Health Practice on 02/08/18. They received funding to provide technical assistance for Strategic Planning initiatives. We are in the planning stages for our next Strategic Plan.
 - iv. The 2017 Community Health Assessment and 2017 Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) have been printed and distribution has started. We received \$15,380 from the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) for completion of the Community Health Assessment. The money will be used to align the health district assessments with the required hospital assessments. K. Bean, D. Brannen, L. Fox, A. Steveley and S. Wynn work together to keep data monitoring and information flowing to the community and workgroups for the four CHIP priorities. Priorities were obesity, first trimester care, drug overdose deaths, and falls in the elderly.
 - b. *Emergency Preparedness* (K. Caudill)
 - i. The Emergency Response and Epidemiology Plans were submitted to ODH for feedback.
 - ii. Three new MRC volunteers are pending.
 - c. *Epidemiology* (Don Brannen)
 - i. Provided quality indicator data for the Ohio Performance Profile Database.
 - ii. Greene County Career Center Health Occupation Students of America scheduled meetings on 01/26, 02/09, 02/16, 03/02, 03/09, 04/06, 04/13, 04/14 (5k). The students' competition rounds are on 02/20/18 for regionals and the state finals are on 04/10 and 04/11/18.

 - i. M Howell met with Greene County Administration to discuss the demolition of the existing facility. A survey will be completed prior to demolition to assess for harmful substances. Employees participated in brick-laying.

 - i. We are transitioning to Easy Clocking for time and activity tracking. The system is electronic and interfaces with the Greene County Auditor's Visual Intelligence Pro software. Many other county departments use the software. The plan is to take the system live in April. We currently use pen and paper.

 - i. Registered 157 contractors for 2018; sold 30 permits; reviewed eight commercial plumbing plans; conducted 157 inspections

 - i. 2018 registrations for sewage system installers, service providers and septage haulers continues.

e. *Water*

- i. J. Gruza is inspecting the local water haulers to ensure that each water hauler is registered for 2018. The water haulers provide potable water to homes and businesses that do not have sufficient well water and rely on water storage tanks for their water supply. The list of approved water haulers in Greene County is sent to ODH each year to add to the statewide list of water haulers for emergency planning use.
