1. Administration

a. Accreditation

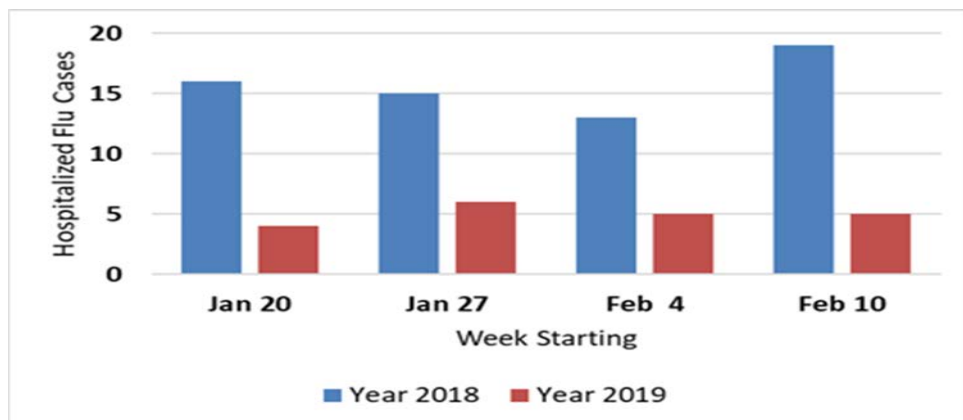
- i. The Greene County Board of County Commissioners passed a resolution recognizing the health district’s accreditation accomplishment.

b. Emergency Preparedness

- i. The Emergency Response Plan has been partially activated to respond to an outbreak of Hepatitis A. Over 30,000 doses of vaccine have been shipped to 102 health districts and 27 federally qualified healthcare centers. Internal planning meetings are held every other week. Hepatitis A Outbreak Summary for Ohio as of 01/14/2019:
 1. Number of cases: 1,438
 2. Illness onset range: 01/05/2018 –01/08/2019
 3. Age range: 2-81 years
 4. Gender: 60% male
 5. Number of hospitalizations: 898 (62%)
 6. Number of deaths: 5
 7. Number of counties with cases: 67 (76%)

c. Epidemiology

- i. Complaints have been received about flu in the area increasing, estimates of local activity do not appear to be more than expected. This season’s flu vaccine has been a good match at protecting persons against the flu virus. In the US 140,000 to 960,000 hospitalizations from the flu have occurred each year since 2010. CDC estimates that since October 1, 2018 there have been 9,600 to 15,900 flu deaths. The current season appears to be one of the milder flu seasons. Below is the number of flu cases hospitalized over the past month for Greene County this season compared to last season.
