

ILLNESS REPORTING FOR FOOD EMPLOYEES

You <u>must</u> report to the Person-in-Charge (PIC)

Food Worker Responsibilities:

- You must report any of the symptoms to the PIC and you MAY NOT WORK if you have:
 - Vomiting
 - Diarrhea
 - Jaundice
 - Sore throat with fever
 - A sore, boil or infected wound that is open or draining and located on the hands, wrists, or arms which may come into contact with food or food contact surfaces
- You must report to the PIC if you have been diagnosed with one of the following infectious agents, or if you have been exposed to any individual by attending a function, working at an operation that has an outbreak of, or live in a household with anyone diagnosed with any of the asterisked (*) infectious agents.

Campylobacter
Cryptosporidium
Cyclospora
Entamoeba histolytica
*Enterhemorrhagic or
Shiga toxin-producing Escherichia coli
Giardia

*Hepatitis A virus
*Norovirus
Salmonella spp.
*Salmonella typhi
*Shigella
Vibrio cholerae
Yersinia

Manager Responsibilities:

- Must inform all food employees of the Illness Reporting Policy, and maintain a sign-off sheet reviewable by a Health District personnel during inspection.
- PIC must notify Greene County Public Health Environmental Health (937-374-5607) when a food employee is diagnosed with one of the above infectious agents.
- Must exclude all ill food employees and conditional employees from the establishment when they are diagnosed with one of the above infectious agents.
- Must exclude the food employee if they have any of the symptoms listed above; or restrict the duties of an employee who are experiencing persistent sneezing, coughing, or runny nose.
- A Health Care provider and/or the Health District is the responsible entity that may release an excluded food worker, depending upon the Ohio Administrative Code requirements.
- PIC may remove an exclusion or restriction from an employee if symptoms listed above have ceased, and the illness was <u>not</u> from an infectious agent listed above.
