## 2. **Environmental Health**

### a. *Food Establishment/Food Service*

- i. The team is working to complete all food inspections by the end of the licensure year on 02/28/2021. Additionally, C. DeBrosse began processing food license renewal applications and mailing out the 2021 food licenses.
- ii. The state legislature passed house bill (HB) 404 in November which extended all licenses/permits that were scheduled to renew between March 2020 - March 2021 until 06/30/2021. This means that no late fees for these permits/licenses can be assessed until 07/01/2021. HB 404 does not apply to the 2021 license for camps and swimming pools but does apply to the food program licenses.
- iii. House bill 674 was passed by the state legislature in December 2020. The bill impacts the issuance of a food license for brewpubs. This bill exempts certain brewpubs that hold A-1c and A-1-A liquor permits from the requirement to obtain a food license from a board of health and operate as a restaurant. There are some stipulations involving this and this new bill becomes effective on 04/12/2021. Local health districts have questions that have been posed to ODH regarding this new bill, and as of this date no guidance has been received from ODH.
- iv. The health district will conduct the next ServSafe training class on 03/15 and 03/22/2021 at the Fraternal Order of Eagles lodge on Second Street in Xenia. The Eagles have donated their meeting space to the health district, which will allow for many more students in attendance while also maintaining social distancing. N. Crawford has been instrumental in working with the Eagles and getting everyone scheduled to attend the class.

### b. *Sewage*

- i. The team continues working through the new 2021 registrations for sewage system installers, service providers and septage haulers to ensure that all the contractors working in the sewage program are property registered for this year. The registration process is a joint venture between the health district and ODH.

### c. *Solid Waste*

- i. M. Isaacson will be part of a panel discussion for the Solid Waste Division of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (OEPA) on 02/24/21. The webinar will be

discussing solid waste issues for 2021. The panel discussion will be discussing various county's solid waste response to the 2019 Memorial Day tornadoes.

- d. *Mosquito*
  - i. Clarke Mosquito Products has been informed by the Environmental Protection Agency that some of the plastic containers that the adulticide products are shipped and stored in have been contaminating the product with per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS or PFOS) chemicals. The chemicals leach out of the plastic bottles and contaminate the adulticide product. Clarke will replace all the health district's adulticide product with new product in better plastic packaging.
  - ii. Greene County will not be applying for the mosquito grant offered by the OEPA in 2021. The grant program has become more restrictive, and the application process is more competitive. The health district is well supplied with materials and equipment for the 2021 mosquito season.
- e. *Nuisance*
  - i. J. Gruza is working with Bath Township and the Greene County Prosecutor's office regarding an abandoned property on Bath Road. The house has not been occupied for more than five years and the inside of the house has been heavily damaged by raccoons and other animals. The owner lives out of state and has not responded to health district orders to repair the property. Bath Township would like to demolish the house.

### 3. **Maternal Child Health**

- a. *Early Intervention*
  - i. Referrals to the program have returned to pre-COVID averages at 38. Some of the highest referring sources continue to be parents and physicians but referrals from Children Services also increased for January.
  - ii. The program is paying particular attention to transition compliance for the next cycle of monitoring by Department of Development Disabilities (DODD) in the spring.
  - iii. The director of Four Oaks and P. Hamer are beginning to look at protocols and procedures for resuming in-person visits in preparation for when in-person visits become a viable option for families.
  - iv. Coordination of Infant Mental Health with the Educational Services Center continues to flourish and support the team and administrators.
- b. *Early Childhood Home Visiting:*
  - i. Growing goals for home visitors and participants are gaining momentum and creating new opportunities for families to be successful with obtaining resources, gaining new life skills, and creating healthy strategies in everyday parenting practices.
  - ii. The team is currently at capacity at 51 families receiving services. There are five families on the waitlist.
  - iii. The incentive program for February provided diapers and wipes. March's incentive will be cleaning supplies and small babyproofing items.
- c. *Baby Me and Tobacco Free*
  - i. Two pregnant moms and a support person enrolled in Baby & Me Tobacco Free. One family is extremely eager to get started and have set a quit date of 03/01/2021.

- ii. One participant shared how she has been using the coping strategies learned during her prenatal visits to help when she is feeling agitated with her spouse or children. She shares how everyone used to laugh at her for reciting the 5 D's (delay, do something else, discuss, drink water, deep breathe) but now her husband is using the same strategies when coping with everyday hassles and stress.
