b. *COVID-19 Response*

- i. Greene County was selected to participate in an ordering project for second doses of vaccine. Representatives from Accenture were on site at clinics to improve the system's operability. Additional offsite clinics were planned for children 16+ years of age. Hondros College, Abiding Christ, Ohio National Guard, Department of Aging, and the health district offered vaccine at several senior housing facilities.
- ii. Monthly virtual Emergency Operations Center meetings are held, and the Incident Management team meets every two weeks to plan activities in response to the pandemic and keep the community informed. The West Central Ohio Healthcare Preparedness Committee also meets to discuss ongoing response.

3. **Environmental Health**

- a. *Food Establishment/Food Service*
 - i. The Person in Charge (PIC) Manager Certification course scheduled for April 14 was cancelled due to lack of registrations.
 - ii. Food operations have until July 1 to renew their food licenses for the 2021 licensure year per HB 404. Any food operation that has not renewed their license by that date will be assessed a 25% penalty fee.

- b. *Mosquito*
 - i. The 2021 Mosquito Control program will start on 04/15/2021 utilizing existing equipment and materials. The team will apply larvicide to known problem areas and neighborhoods to help prevent the development of adult mosquitoes. Greene County will not be participating in the recall of the Clarke Mosquito Control products. We will use the products that we have on hand and not try to replace them with products in better containers. There may be a problem with the replacement of the products coming from Clarke.
- c. *Sewage*
 - i. A local plumbing company has purchased the old Greene County Career Center. M. Isaacson will meet with the owners to discuss the complicated sewage system at the facility and the plans for future uses.
- d. *Solid Waste*
 - i. The solid waste hauling vehicle registrations will be renewed in May and plans are being made to inspect the vehicles to ensure that all standards are met for these vehicles. The health district registered 209 vehicles during 2020.

4. **Maternal Child Health**

- a. *Early Intervention*
 - i. P. Hamer has been working with the Four Oaks director to create “stage 1” procedures for limited in-person visits by Four Oaks direct staff. These in-person visits will be based on child and family need. Some examples include fittings for braces, and special equipment assistance; supports that cannot happen via a virtual platform. The service coordinator role in this process is helping to identify needs through parent interviews and observations. Referrals for March were up substantially to 42.
- b. *Early Childhood Home Visiting:*
 - i. The Healthy Families America mission, best practice standards and ODH quality improvements are priorities. Team members gained confidence this month in reflection and goal setting. Home visitors reached billing goals for March, data reflects the hard work and success. Program capacity was increased from 51 to 55 families being serviced. There are no target families on the wait list. We continue to work with Central Intake and Early Head Start to meet family needs for services in our community. One parent started a new support group. Another parent no longer requires Children’s Services support. An active family in the program graduated!
- c. *Baby Me and Tobacco Free*
 - i. Provider packs with an informational letter, referral forms and a variety of colorful and eye-catching posters and flyers were given to county agencies for potential clients. Outreach with WIC continues, and provider packs were shared with local OB/GYN offices. The team advises that it only takes a few minutes to screen for smoking and offer a referral. Our team provides reliable information on unhealthy smoking alternatives such as vaping. The team is encouraged by families desiring to quit smoking marijuana using the same strategies. Motivational Interviewing is used to help families uncover their stressors and look for and experiment with healthy

alternatives such as using the 5 Ds of smoking cessation: Delay, Do Something Else, Discuss, Drink Water and Deep Breathe.
