- i. Case counts and positivity rates are on the decline prompting local public health officials and the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) to explore new ways to keep children in the classroom. The school setting, due to the structured, layered prevention strategies in place have demonstrated they are a low-risk environment for transmission. ODH released updated K-12 [Guidance](#).

3. **Environmental Health**

a. *Food Establishment/Food Service*

- i. The Person In Charge (PIC) Certification course scheduled for October 11 was cancelled due to lack of scheduled attendance. The ServSafe Manager Certification course scheduled for November 8 and 15 has been cancelled due to number of COVID cases and lack of classroom availability. The health district will resume food training courses in March of 2022. The health district provided seven food training courses in 2021 for 91 attendees. One person sat for a proctored ServSafe exam, and seven individuals retested the ServSafe exam.
- ii. In early October, T. Myers, C. Propes, K. Ray, and R. Schairbaum completed food exemption inspections for seven community libraries that are hosts for the Children's Hunger Alliance. The communities involved are Beavercreek, Cedarville, Fairborn, Jamestown, Bellbrook, Xenia and Yellow Springs.
- iii. C. Propes sat in on a Spanish speaking food training class (manager level) taught by an outside company for the employees of El Toro. Employees were from Greene County locations as well as Clark, Warren, and Montgomery Counties. C. Propes provided some learning materials, signs for handwashing (in Spanish), as well as some food thermometers/probe wipes. Interjected at times for emphasis on proper cooling,

prevention of cross contamination, need for temperature monitoring/recording, managerial control, and other issues observed within the facilities. The instructor did an excellent job of connecting culturally with the class.

- iv. Since the previous monthly activity report, General and Special Services team members performed inspections at the Cedarville University Homecoming, Old Timer's Festival, Spring Valley Potato Festival, Fairborn Halloween Fest, Festival of Flight, Harvest on Main Street (Xenia), and several individual events where food operations had a temporary food license. The festival season is nearly complete, and the team has made it a successful festival season despite the challenges presented due to COVID.

b. *Mosquito Control*

- i. ODH will stop testing mosquitoes in October. Greene County Public Health submitted 21 pools of mosquitoes to ODH in 2021 with four positive pools. Forty-nine Ohio counties have trapped West Nile Virus (WNV) positive mosquitoes in 2021. Clark and Warren County have positive pools in 2021. The mosquito program for 2021 ended on October 1, 2021.
- ii. Ohio currently has nine human cases of WNV. Two cases in Clark County and one case in Montgomery County. WNV virus activity in humans and mosquitoes in Greene County is comparable to statewide activity in the past years.
- iii. The health district helped with the Tire Amnesty Drop Off event at Environmental Services on 09/30 2021. M. Isaacson distributed 27 packets of mosquito information and larvicide to the residents that brought in tires.

c. *Solid Waste*

- i. The owner of a property in Bath Township has been cited into Fairborn Municipal Court due to the lack of repairs to his abandoned house. J. Gruza has been working with the Bath Township Zoning inspector for many years to resolve this issue.

d. *Private Water Systems*

- i. The Test your Well Event has been postponed until Spring 2022. The new water testing laboratory had difficulty with scheduling and the fees were more expensive. The new date will be chosen early so that the time and scheduling problems will be worked out in early 2022.

a. *Early Intervention*

- i. There has been an increase in families in need of community resources this month. Also, the program experienced the loss of a child due to medical reasons. While it was a challenging month, it provided the opportunity for service coordinators, Four Oaks staff, and supervisors to meet virtually with infant mental health consultants to share challenges and grief enabling reflection and healing.
