### 3. **Environmental Health**

#### a. *Food Establishment/Food Service*

- i. On 12/07/21, R. Schairbaum and C. Propes conducted a follow-up inspection at a local bar and grill following an Environmental Health Director's meeting with J. Webb on 11/10/21. Based upon the findings, the operator was ordered to appear on 12/21/21 for a Health Commissioner's Hearing. Presenting for the health district was C. Propes, R. Schairbaum, and J. Webb. Health Commissioner Howell will issue a written decision within 10 days of the hearing.

#### b. *Body Art*

- i. R. Schairbaum and C. Propes continue to work with Wright Patterson Air Force Base regarding the new body art establishment that will be constructed. This business is currently going through the plan review process and will begin operation in early 2022.
- ii. C. DeBrosse is preparing to print food license renewal applications for the 2022 licensure year to be mailed the week of 01/03/22.

#### c. *Sewage*

- i. The 15<sup>th</sup> annual Greene County Sewage Contractor Training meeting was held on 12/14/2021. The meeting was well attended with 65 people present. The Special Services team made presentations at the meeting. Many good comments were received, and J. Webb distributed a customer satisfaction survey to the contractors.
- ii. The 2022 Sewage System Contractor registration information was sent out in December. ODH has not waived continuing education requirements for 2022. All sewage contractors must have earned 12 hours of continuing education to register for 2022.
- iii. A sewage system alteration was installed and approved in December 2021 at a house on Trebein Road, Beavercreek Township. This house had had a long history of sewage issues that were finally resolved with the installation.

### 4. **Maternal Child Health**

#### a. *Early Intervention (EI)*

- i. The program received the state family survey results. Greene County had one of the highest response rates in the state 31.86% – beating the state response rate of 20.80%. Nevertheless, the survey response rates dropped in every area from the previous year. Parents were able to add written comments and the consensus was in-person services were preferred by families over virtual visits though they understood the necessity. However, parents did include a lot of great positive responses such as the following:

1. *The physical therapist and developments specialist confirmed my concerns and directed me to a medical professional who respected their opinion . I was then taken seriously, and my child was diagnosed with cancer.*
  2. *Kaitlyn Gillum and Kim Sullivan have been fantastic. Really the whole crew my child has with Linda, Gina, and Bridgett. Doing the IFSP not only helps us touch base with everyone it also helps our family see our child’s progress. I know it’s a small thing, but we really don’t see it since we live it every day and it really is a blessing to be able to realize her progress.*
  3. *I love how EI manages the transition to the school's preschool program, that has been a very smooth easy process & appreciate them being the liaison for it.*
  4. *We have been incredibly happy with our EI experience. Our child has progressed and achieved set goals. We appreciate the hard work of our EI, Julie, and our service coordinator, Molly (Vaught).*
- ii. Four Oaks is currently working on developing a formal process for requesting in-person services when progress isn’t being made via virtual services – hopefully this will be finalized by the second week in January. - i. The program remains constant with the assistance of Shernaz Reporter, health educator, also working on outreach in the program and will participate in facilitator training. The entire team continues to promote the program with our community partners.
