- b. *COVID-19 Response*
 - i. Participate in statewide PIO call with Ohio Department of Health (ODH).
 - ii. Interviews with local media/staff
 - iii. Posted COVID-19 county update on Thursdays; posted Community Level on Fridays (Low, Medium, High) – both on website and social media.
 - iv. Monitored phone messages for COVID test-to-treat kits.
 - v. Worked with vaccine planning team to develop graphics/flyers as needed for upcoming clinics, events.

3. **Environmental Health**

- a. *Food Establishment/Food Service*
 - i. T. Myers taught two person-in-charge (PIC) classes for 16 students. No more food training classes are scheduled for the remainder of the calendar year. In 2022, 10 food training courses were conducted, for 171 attendees. The 2023 food training schedule will be posted in January 2023 onto our webpage.
 - ii. The 2023 food license renewal applications were mailed to our food operators the week of 12/26/22.
 - iii. Michelle Ratcliff from the ODH provided food service operation inspection field training to the General and Special Services team members on 12/7-12/9/22.
 - iv. In 2022, 176 temporary food licenses were issued.

- b. *Body Art*
 - i. Body Art license renewals are due by 12/31/22 for the 2023 licensure year. Letters will be mailed out in January to delinquent establishments noting the penalty fee.
- c. *Sewage*
 - i. The 2022 Sewage System Contractor continuing education training was conducted on 12/09/22. Fifty (50) contractors attended and received 6.0 hours of continuing education credit. Special Services hosted a ‘round table’ session to address personnel and procedure changes at the health district.
 - ii. The first National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) onsite sewage treatment system was installed on US 68 S. This system treats water to a quality on par with rainwater. It replaced a system that was previously just two buried 55-gallon drums and a few feet of leach line.
- d. *Solid Waste*
 - i. After consulting with Environmental Health Special Services, Ohio EPA, and Greene County Sanitary Engineering, Little Miami Conservancy disposed of approximately 300 scrap tires left on a property they recently acquired. This lot is part of a wetlands area that will be restored to its natural state.

 - i. We currently have nine families in the program. Supplemental cards and brochures from ODH are being supplied to partner agencies.
- b. *Help Me Grow Home Visiting-Healthy Families America*
 - i. We are happy to end the year with a full team of six Early Childhood home visitors, including four for Healthy Families and two Nurse-Family Partnership nurses. We are increasing team members' capacity.
 - ii. The Healthy Families America (HFA) program is at our current capacity. The team continues to provide families with Kroger Gift Cards to offset costs under the ODH Quarterly Incentive Retention Plan.
 - iii. Our Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) We have been up to 15 families and continue to work with program partners to boost referrals.
