- b. *Epidemiology*
 - i. Total of seven Greene County residents were monitored after returning from the Ebola affected area in Uganda from November 2022 through January 2023. World Health Organization declares Ebola outbreak over 01/11/23. The last remaining traveler’s surveillance truncated.
 - ii. Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) trending down.
 - iii. Southwest and West Central Ohio had an increase of *norovirus GII* activity. No outbreaks in Greene County but diarrheal illnesses caused syndromic surveillance alerts mid-January in area emergency room visits.
 - iv. Long-term care will be asked to complete line listings of persons sick with invasive *Streptococcus pneumoniae* due to growing antibiotic resistance. Exposure and vaccination history will also be asked for. *S. pneumoniae* is a vaccine preventable disease with pneumococcal vaccine.
 - v. Antibiotic resistant *Candidis auris* is on the rise in Ohio and the world.

 - i. Health Commissioner Howell, Director Wynn, Epidemiologist Dr. Brannen, and Dr. Shuster (CDC Foundation) published paper on *Pandemic Isolation and Mental Health Among Children. Disaster Medicine and Public Health Preparedness*, 1-19. Doi:10.1017dmp.2023.7
 - ii. Posted COVID-19 county update on Thursdays; posted community level on Fridays (Low, Medium, High) – both on website and social media
 - iii. Monitored phone messages for COVID test-to-treat kits.

e. *Emergency Preparedness*

- i. Greene County Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) Unit Leader, Dr. Brannen, received Radiation Workshop Travel award for the 2023 Preparedness Summit in Atlanta Georgia in April 2023.
- ii. On behalf of the health commissioner and other authors Dr. Bidigare (Sinclair Community College, and Dr. Shuster (Kents State and Cleveland State) and Dr. Brannen will be presenting a poster on Medical Reserve Corps Volunteers' Characteristics Affect Disaster Survival at the 2023 Preparedness Summit, April 24-17, 2003. The focus of the summit is Reprioritizing All-Hazards. This will meet a final deliverable for the 2022 MRC Operational Readiness Award.
- iii. 02/17/23 Ohio Department of Health (ODH) Statewide Radiation Tabletop Exercise (TTX) followed by a West Central Ohio Radiation TTX.
- iv. Posted winter safety/weather travel on Greene County Public Health social media sites.

2. **Environmental Health**

a. *Food Establishment/Food Service*

- i. General Services team worked to complete all food inspections by the end of the licensure year, 02/28/23.
- ii. ServSafe food training will be taught on four occasions in 2023. Person in Charge (PIC) Certification courses will only be taught at a food operation's location in 2023.
- iii. R. Schairbaum proctored four ServSafe exams proctored on 02/08/23.
- iv. R. Schairbaum worked with the Courtyard Dayton Beavercreek to reopen their food operations after being closed for over a year. Their public swimming pool remains closed until they are ready for Greene County Public Health inspection(s).
- v. R. Schairbaum met with representatives from the City of Xenia City Planner, Department of Development, Greene County Building Department, National Inspection Corporation (NIC), and perspective new food business owners on 01/09/23. One of those meetings occurred at the former Xenia China Inn.

b. *Body Art*

- i. Body art establishments for 2023 are licensed with the following exceptions: one decided to permanently close, two were issued cease and desist orders and are currently not operating, and two were in the process of obtaining their licenses by the end of February. Delinquent establishments were assessed a 25% penalty fee.

c. *Sewage*

- i. Special Services employees identified a new barn illegally converted into a residence in Sugarcreek Township. A joint meeting with Township, Zoning, and Fire Departments, and Greene County building officials was scheduled. The homeowner admitted that the family had moved in without the benefit of any sewage, private water, plumbing, or residential building permits. Several orders were issued, and all parties are working together to ensure a safe, compliant home for this family.
- ii. Special Services fielded a complaint about a common drain tile that serves the Bend at Washington Mill subdivision alleging one of the homeowners had allowed his children to vandalize the tile. The inspection confirmed the problem, which is affecting the performance of the septic systems on the whole north side of the development. (Each

homeowner is responsible for maintaining his/her section of the tile.) Special Services is currently working with Sugarcreek Township on an enforcement strategy.

- iii. The health district's cooperative effort with Greene County Development District to demolish nuisance properties continues. Greene County Public Health oversaw two septic tank abandonments and three private well abandonments.
- iv. J. Marks begins weekly online training to attain his drone pilot's license. When he successfully passes the exam, three Special Services employees will be FAA licensed drone pilots.
