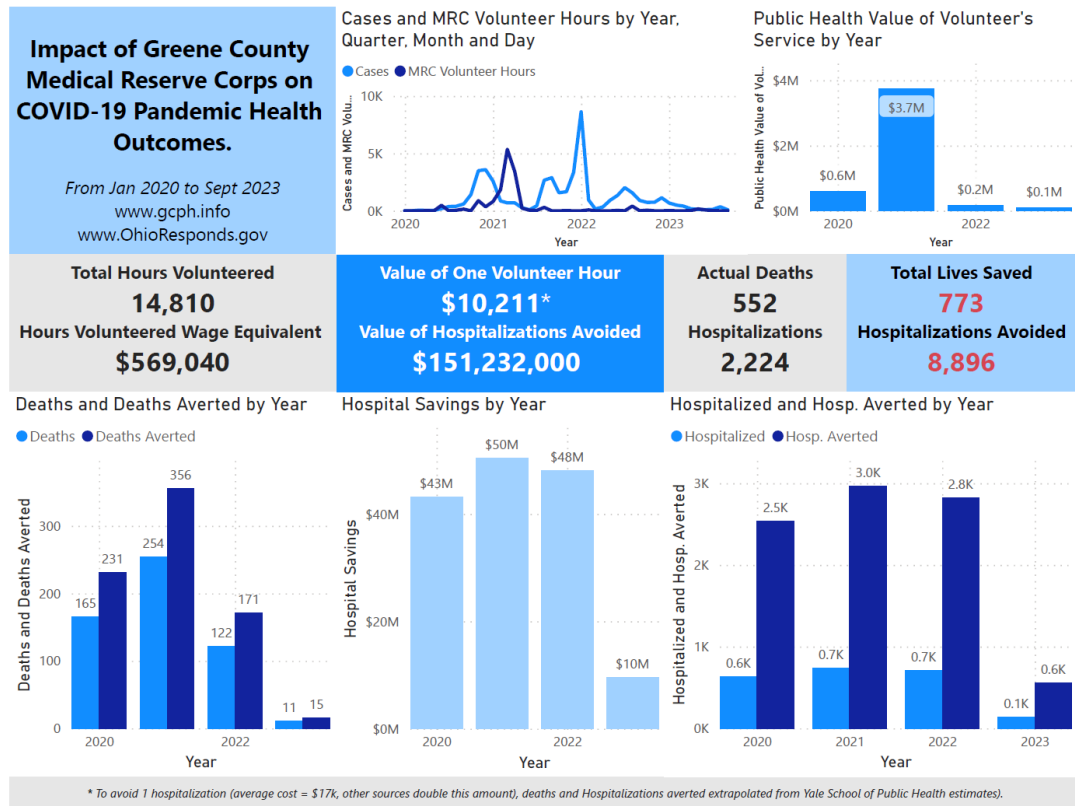

3. Environmental Health

a. Food Establishment/Food Service

- i. The Environmental Health food service operation program was surveyed by ODH the week of 09/11/23. The exit interview was conducted on 09/20/23. ODH informed our team in the exit interview that Greene County Public Health performed very well, and it runs an excellent program. We should expect to see the written report in ~45 days. A. Glascoe, M. Straight, D. Shontz, J. Marks and J. Gruza all participated in field training with ODH on 09/12/23.
- ii. R. Schairbaum and T. Myers worked with the Community Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics (STEAM) Academy of Xenia to open their new location on Lower Bellbrook Road.
- iii. A. Glascoe conducted a Person-in-Charge (PIC) certification food training at the Xenia Eagles for fourteen attendees on 09/20/23.
- iv. Environmental Health performed inspections for the Beavercreek Popcorn Festival, Hairborn, Jamestown Fall Festival, Old Timers Festival, and minor food temporary operations. A total of 109 temporary food licenses have been issued for the 2023 food licensure year.

- b. *Swimming Pools*
 - i. The General Services team completed all outdoor pool inspections for the season. For the remainder of the calendar year only indoor pools will be inspected.
- c. *Mosquito*
 - i. The Mosquito Program remains steady this year, as the weather has been conducive to mosquito growth. Greene County has had five West Nile Virus-positive mosquito pools from our testing.
 - ii. Greene County Public Health received a verbal commitment from Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to consider grant petitions for drone equipment to be used in vector control. This follows months of outreach and hard work by J. Webb and D. Shontz to prove the potential benefit of this new tool for mosquito control.
- d. *Solid Waste*
 - i. Ohio EPA conducted our annual Solid Waste Program Survey 09/11/23 – 09/13/23. Greene County Public Health remains in approved standing.

 - i. J. Barga and N. Kessinger visited many Obstetrician offices in the county to provide Early Childhood Home Visiting (ECHV) information and make sure they were aware we now offer two models. M. McCullough and I. Barnett reached out to Hope Rising in Xenia and the Community Center in Bellbrook to provide ECHV information.

 - i. I. Barnett worked with Family & Youth Initiatives and The Parenting Network to agree to refer to us and us to refer to them. The establishment of this partnership will benefit Greene County families in both of our programs. Family & Youth Initiative is a learn to earn program and the parents can earn baby bucks to shop in their store. For families enrolled in both programs, they receive ten additional baby bucks for each home visit they complete.
